



The Library will host critically acclaimed author Kieran Shields in the historic Reading Room on Tuesday, December 11 at 6:30pm. Shields' new novel "The Truth of All Things" is the featured book of the month at the library, and the Bailey Title Waves Book Group will discuss the novel the following week on December 19 at 6:00pm.

Kieran Shields grew up in Portland, Maine. He graduated from Dartmouth College and the University of Maine School of Law. He continues to reside along the coast of Maine with his wife and two children. "The Truth of All Things," which received a rare star review from the prestigious Kirkus Reviews as well as Publisher's Weekly, is his first novel. The follow-up "A Study in Revenge" is due out in 2013.

Both the author event and book group discussion are free and open to the public. Apple Valley Books will have copies of Shields' books for sale.

Literary Favorites: Sweet Tooth by Ian McEwan

In this stunning new novel, lan McEwan's first female protagonist since Atonement is about to learn that espionage is the ultimate seduction.

Cambridge student Serena Frome's beauty and intelligence make her the ideal recruit for MI5. The year is 1972. The Cold War is far from over. England's legendary intelligence agency is determined to manipulate the cultural conversation by funding writers whose politics align with those of the government. The operation is code named "Sweet Tooth."



Serena, a compulsive reader of novels, is the perfect candidate to infiltrate the literary circle of a promising young writer named Tom Haley. At first, she loves his stories. Then she begins to love the man. How long can she conceal her undercover life? To answer that question, Serena must abandon the first rule of espionage: trust no one.

Once again, lan McEwan's mastery dazzles us in this superbly deft and witty story of betrayal and intrigue, love and the invented self.


