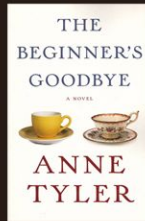

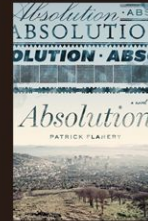
Question Boy Meets Little Miss Know-It-All by Peter Catalanotto

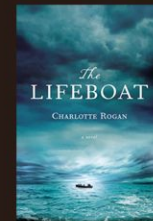

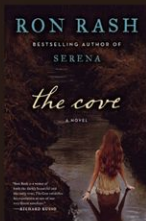

Lakes Region Forum April Speaker: Paul Doiron



Paul Doiron will give a reading and discuss his new book, *Trespasser*, at the library on Tuesday, April 17th at 6:30pm as part of the library's Lakes Region Forum. *Trespasser* is Doiron's riveting follow-up to his Edgar Award-nominated novel, *The Poacher's Son*.

Doiron is an award-winning journalist, and his fiction has been nominated for the Anthony, Barry, Thriller, and Strand Critics Awards, in addition to the prestigious Edgar. His second book in the Mike Bowditch series, *Trespasser* was an American Booksellers Association Indie Bestseller and has been called a "masterpiece of high-octane narrative" by Booklist. He is the Editor in Chief of *Down East: The Magazine of Maine*, *Down East Books*, and *DownEast.com*. A native of Maine, he attended Yale University, where he graduated with a degree in English, and he holds an MFA in creative writing from Emerson College. Paul is a Registered Maine Guide and lives on a trout stream in coastal Maine with his wife, Kristen Lindquist.
