

To use the new system, simply download the app for your device by going to: your cloudlibrary.com and selecting United States, Maine, and Winthrop. You can also open the Apple App Store (on Apple devices) or the Google Play Store (on Android devices) and search for cloudLibrary.

#### NEW BOOK COMING SOON: Since We Fell by Dennis Lehane

The latest entry in Lehane's body of work gives us plenty of intrigue, intricacies, and emotional subtleties. Lehane's delicate rendering of journalist Rachel Childs' various symptoms include: panic, rage, depression, and, most of all, self-loathing. The final blow to Rebecca's self-esteem comes when her rise to prominence as a Boston TV reporter crashes due to her on-camera nervous collapse. Through all her jolts and traumas, one person is always around: Brian Delacroix, a witty, handsome businessman, whom she first meets as a private investigator. What seems at the start to be an edgy psychological mystery seamlessly transforms into a crafty, ingenious tale of murder and deception, and a deeply resonant account of one woman's effort to heal deep wounds.

# Debut Author Spotlight: M.L. Dio

#### NEW BOOK COMING SOON: If We Were Villains by M. L. Rio

For a clique of aspiring Shakespearean actors at an elite arts academy, the line between performance and reality dissolves, with disastrous results. In the prologue to this suspenseful debut novel, we meet former drama student Oliver Marks, now finishing a 10-year prison sentence. He is visited by the officer who brought him to justice on the eve of his retirement, asking if Marks will finally tell him the truth of what happened that night at Dellecher Classical Conservatory. He agrees to do so on the condition that there are no repercussions for revealing his secrets. As the novel progresses the characters begin to address each other constantly in quotes from Shakespeare's poetry and bits of sarcasm from the plays. Shakespeare's characters have taken over their souls, and the power struggles, jealousies, and murderous rages that fill the dramas have crossed into real life. "I have ransacked Shakespeare's entire oeuvre with giddy abandon," Rio confesses in her Author's Note, managing to cleverly weave a whole new story from the poetry and plots of Macbeth, Caesar, Romeo and Juliet, and King Lear. "Do you blame Shakespeare for any of it?" the retired detective asks the released convict. "I blame him for all of it," the narrator replies. This novel about obsession at the conservatory will thoroughly obsess you.

Liam Neeson plays the title character in "A Monster Calls," a teen film that adults will enjoy. One night a tree monster uproots itself to come crashing into the bedroom of young Conor O'Malley, who insists he is not afraid of the creature. This monster is not scary because what Conor faces every day in the real world is much scarier: his mother is fighting a terminal illness, and bullies at school harass him constantly. So what could a monster do that could possibly be worse? The film (adapted from a book by Patrick Ness) is about coping with grief and loss, and accepting that anger is a part of that process. Cathartic and thrilling all at the same time.

### Lakes Region Forum: Caitlin Shetterly



The library will host writer and theatre director Caitlin Shetterly on Tuesday, April 25th at 6:30pm. The event is part of the ongoing Winthrop Lakes Region Forum and is sponsored by the Winthrop Public Library Foundation. Caitlin will discuss her new book 'Modified,' which was named one of Publishers Weekly's Best Books of 2016, and explores America's use of GMOs, and her own journey to cut genetically modified corn from her diet. Throughout the journey, Shetterly and her husband Dan became hardcore farmer's market shoppers and dedicated to Community Supported Agriculture. Shetterly studied English and American Literature at Brown University and is a frequent contributor to NPR. She has written for The New York Times, Elle, and Oprah.com. She is the Founder and Artistic Director of the Winter Harbor Theatre Company, where she produces and directs works that attempt to tackle the important issues of our time. She lives with her husband, photographer Daniel E. Davis, their son, and their dog, Hopper.
