# Sandy's Circus by Tanya Lee Stone

Alexander Calder, better known as Sandy, was a very active child, who loved to build things from objects he found around his home. He and his parents moved often when he was young, but wherever they were, Sandy had his own place to work and tools to use. His mother was a painter, and his father a sculptor, so it was logical he would become some kind of artist. His college studies were in engineering, and only later in art. He sketched advertisements for the Barnum and Bailev Circus, and in 1926 moved to Paris, France, a world art center at that time. He created an entire circus that he could carry around in two suitcases; it was made from wire he bent with pliers to replicate the real thing. People came from far and away as word spread of Sandy's Fabulous Circus. His love of moving things lead to a long career in the art of mobiles, balancing art pieces kept in motion by gentle breezes. #### Lakes Region Forum May Speaker: Joseph Dane



Joseph A. Dane will give a reading and discuss his new book, Dogfish Memory: Sailing in Search of Old Maine on Tuesday, May 22 at 6:30pm. Dogfish is a meditative, unconventional memoir, chronicling a lifetime of sailing the Maine coast. Dane's family has deep roots in Maine, and he writes of his suspension between different versions of Maine: the place as it may be and the place as it's perceived by summer people, tourists, and even salty fishermen. Dane writes about sailing, weather, and the stories of his youth.

Joseph A. Dane is Professor of English at the University of Southern California, and is the author of numerous books. He holds degrees from Bowdoin College and Tulane University and earned his Ph.D. in Comparative Literature at Columbia University. Dane has been called one of the most original historians of print, and his articles appear in Papers of the Bibliographical Society of America, Studies in Bibliography, Huntington Library Quarterly, Gutenberg Jahrbuch, and Modern Language Review.
