

Debut Author Snapshot

NEW BOOK COMING SOON:

A Constellation of Vital Phenomena by Anthony Marra





Seldom does one come across a debut novel of such extraordinary quality and depth. Set in the village of Eldar, Chechnya in the final days of 2004, Marra captures the horrors and desolation of 11 years of war between Sunni Muslim separatists and Russian forces, yet somehow manages to imbue his narrative with a sense of hope and beauty.

Marra's vision of Chechnya in the years following the fall of the Soviet Union is inevitably mordant: religious and separatist battles have left the roadways studded with land mines, the buildings pockmarked with bullets and many residents disappeared and tortured.

Marra artfully weaves his novel back and forth through time to create a panorama of the terror of war and its devastating effects on those who must endure in its zone. The characters in this book become the embodiment of hope.






A brief movie review by Richard Fortin

'Django Unchained' is what we expect (and want) from a Quentin Tarantino movie. The dialogue is masterful, the undertone is funky, and the action violent. In "Django Unchained" however, Tarantino balances his signature style with heart wrenching social consciousness. The portrayal of slavery is as uncompromising as we've ever seen on the big screen, and though this mainly acts as a mechanism to setup the revenge fantasy, the scenes are brutal, agonizing and hard to watch. Influenced by the 1966 Spaghetti Western "Django," "Django Unchained" makes a mockery of racism, to the point of comedy at times. Powerful. Stunning. Flashy. Not for the faint of heart.

Rogers is the author of 'Red Ruby Heart in a Cold Blue Sea.' She grew up in Bath, Maine, and nearby in a small cottage on the New Meadows River. She holds a BA in English and an MFA in Creative Writing from the University of Southern Maine.

'Red Ruby Heart in a Cold Blue Sea' is her debut novel. It was published in Germany, where it won a Reader's Choice award in general literature. A captivating debut, introducing a spirited young heroine coming of age in coastal Maine during the early 1960s. With Fannie Flagg's humor and Elizabeth Strout's sense of place, this debut is an extraordinary snapshot of a bygone America through the eyes of an inspiring girl blazing her own path to womanhood.

Rogers currently splits her time between Maine and western South Dakota. The public is invited to join the library Book Group on Wednesday, May 15 to discuss the novel.
