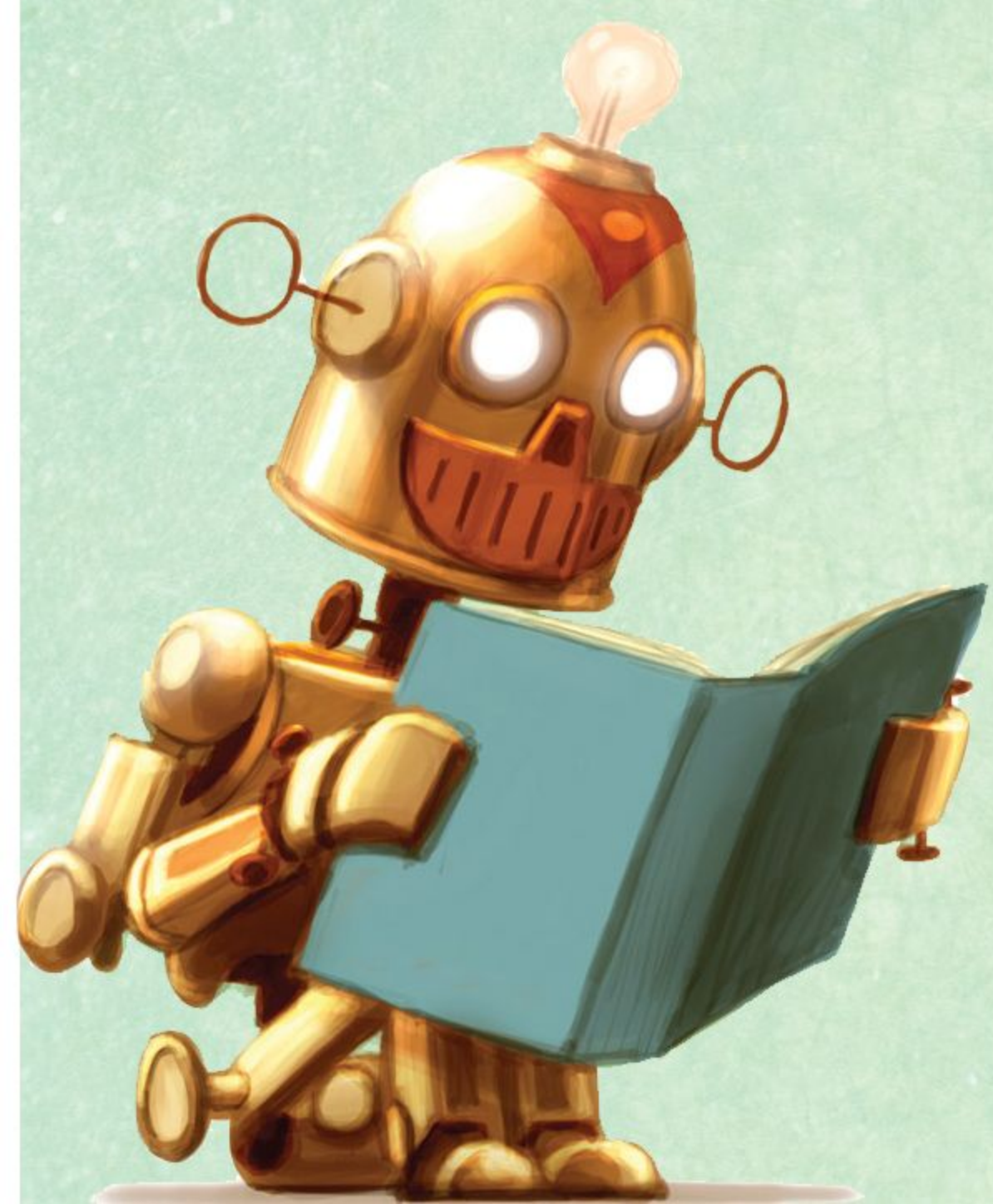

The Bailey Library is hosting lots of exciting children's events all summer to celebrate and encourage summer reading!

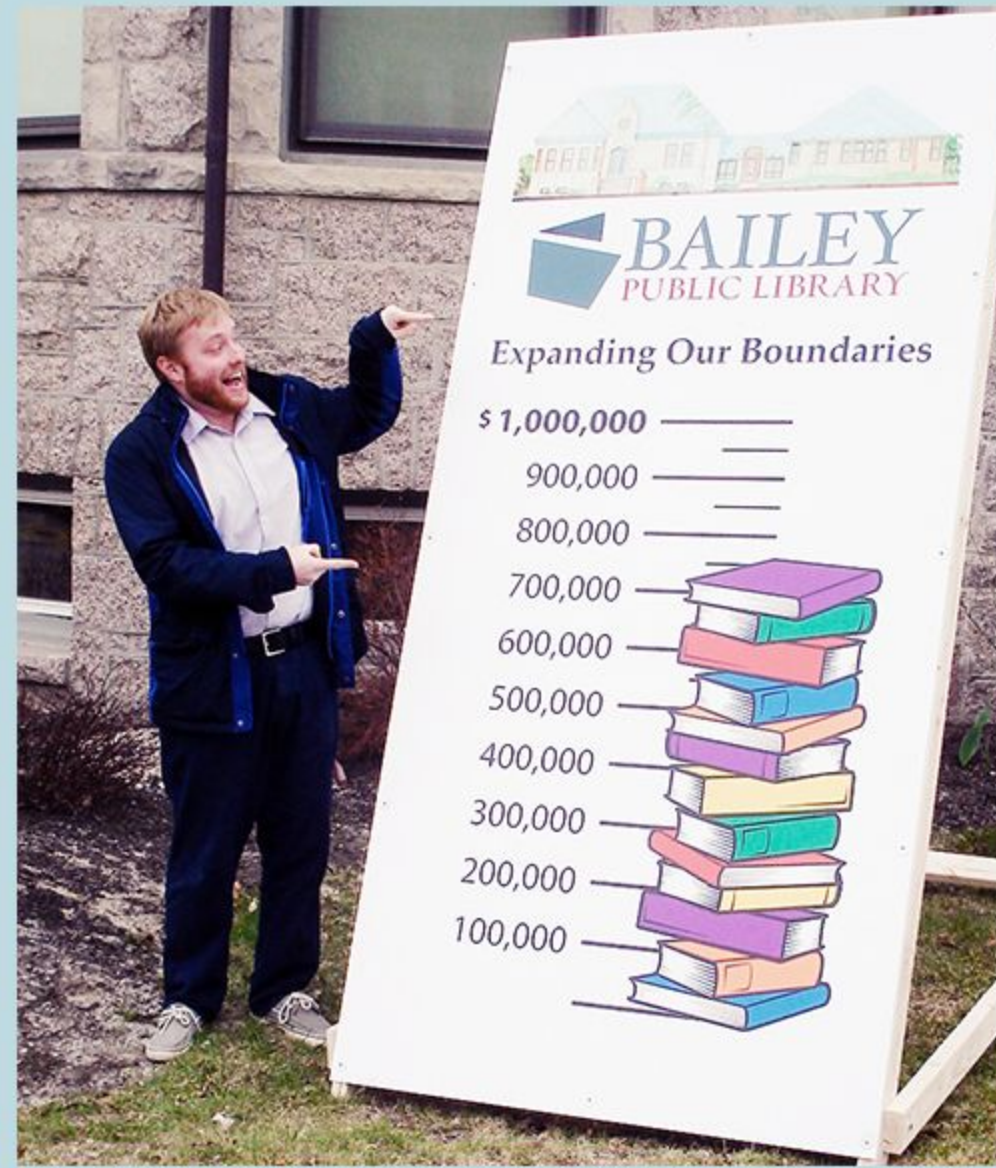

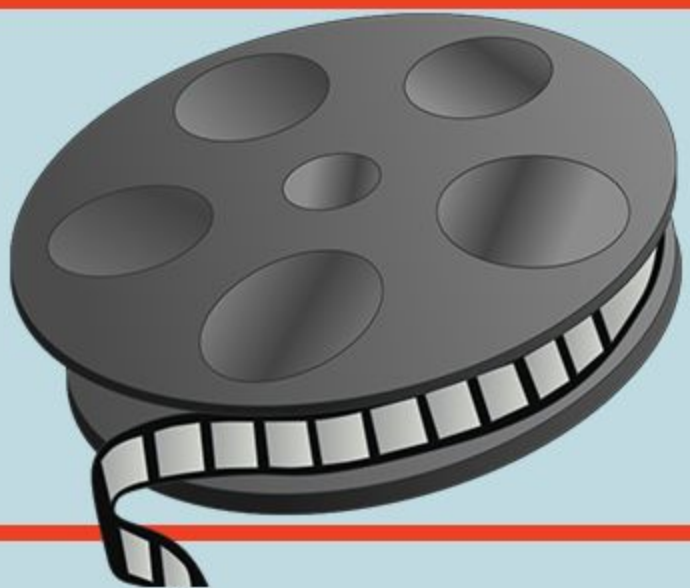
Expanding Our Boundaries Final Phase is Underway



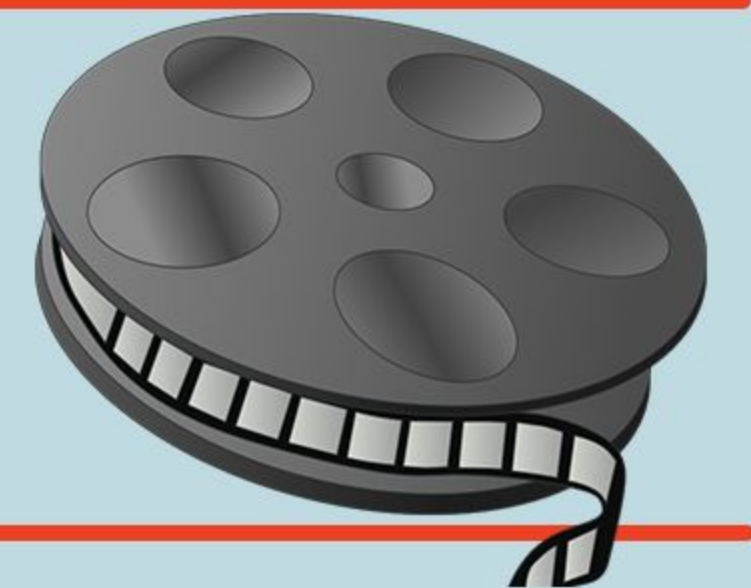
The Campaign Team for the Bailey Library's *Expanding Our Boundaries* Capital Campaign is in the final phase of fundraising. The campaign volunteers have reached 74% of the \$1 million goal. The community is invited to attend a celebration and official launch of the final phase of fundraising at the library on Thursday, May 15 from 5:30–6:00pm. It will be a festive occasion to mark this milestone in the Capital Campaign and share exciting plans for the future of the library. There will be a brief program and all are welcome to view the model and floor plan for the new addition. Library patrons, friends, supporters and community members are all encouraged to attend the celebration.

The new addition for the Bailey Library is one step closer to reality since the Masonic Hall adjacent to the library was demolished in mid-April. The open space makes way for construction to begin later this year on a much-needed addition to the library.

Lakes Region Forum: Christina Baker Kline



Number one New York Times bestseller Christina Baker Kline will read from and discuss her new book 'Orphan Train' on Tuesday, May 13th, beginning at 6:30pm. The talk is part of the ongoing Bailey Library Winthrop Lakes Region Forum.

"Orphan train riders" was not a term that Christina Baker Kline had ever heard until about a decade ago, when she read an article on children without parents who came by rail to Jamestown, N.D., to be adopted, during the years of 1854–1929. The piece featured her husband's grandfather, Frank Robertson, who had been orphaned at age 15 and shipped with his younger siblings from Missouri to North Dakota via rail.

Kline served as Writer-in-Residence at Fordham University from 2007 to 2011, and has taught writing, poetry, English literature, literary theory, and women's studies at Yale, New York University, and Drew University.

Kline has worked as a caterer, cook, and personal chef on the Maine coast, Martha's Vineyard, and in Charlottesville, Virginia. She lives in an old house in Montclair, New Jersey, with her husband and three boys. She spends summers with extended family in an even older house on Mount Desert Island in Maine.
