directed by Jay and Mark Duplass

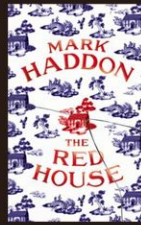


From the lads who brought us "Cyrus," one of the best comedies of 2010, "Jeff, Who Lives at Home" is a deadpan over-the-top adventure about an unambitious thirty-something waiting for a sign (or signs).

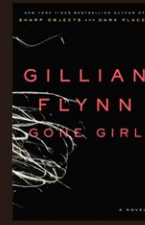
The film follows Jeff, his mother, and brother over the course of a day when they face implausible challenges. Jeff takes coincidences as signs (and obsesses over the movie, "Signs") and continues to end up in increasingly improbable adventures. Segel's performance is undoubtedly the crux of the film.

The predicaments and conversations throughout the film are irresistible and engaging, and by the end, the Duplass brothers might even earn a snivel from the more responsive viewers.

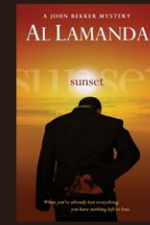

## Lakes Region Forum June Speaker: Jim Nichols



Author Jim Nichols will discuss his recently published book "Hull Creek" on Tuesday, June 19, at 6:30pm. Part of the library's Lakes Region Forum, his talk will take place in the historic Reading Room of the Library.

Nichols was born in Brunswick, raised in Freeport and now lives on the river in Warren with his wife Anne. He has published work in numerous venues and has been anthologized in American Fiction, Contemporary Maine Fiction and others. He is a past winner of the Willamette Fiction Prize and received an Independent Artists Fellowship from the Maine Arts Commission. His collection "Slow Monkeys and Other Stories" was published in 2003 by Carnegie Mellon Press, and "Hull Creek", a novel on Maine Fishing Villages, was published by Down East Books.
