Winthrop Community Read with Monica Wood

The library will host bestselling and critically acclaimed author Monica Wood as part of the annual Winthrop Community Read. Adult Services Librarian Shane Billings will also host a community book discussion on Wednesday, June 19th at 6pm. The book chosen for this year's Winthrop Read event is Wood's newest memoir "When We Were the Kennedys," which is a tribute to the ethnic stew of immigrant families that grew and prospered in a Maine mill town. Wood will read from the book and speak about the creative process on Tuesday, June 25th at 6:30pm. Both events are free and open to the public.

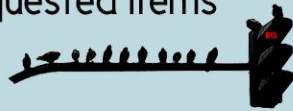
Wood is also the author of four works of fiction, most recently "Any Bitter Thing," which spent 21 weeks on the American Booksellers Association bestseller list and was named a Book Sense top ten pick. Her other fiction includes "Ernie's Ark," "Secret Language" and "My Only Story" –a finalist for the Kate Chopin Award.

Novelist Wood grew up in a mill town in Maine where she was one of many "children of well-paid laborers" who were living the American Dream. But everything changed in April 1963 when her father, upon whom the burden of maintaining that dream rested, died at the age of 57. Without his sure and steady presence, the 9-year-old Wood experienced "a profound dislocation, a feeling like slipping on the shifting surface of my allotted scrap of God's earth." Funny and moving, "When We Were the Kennedys" is the story of how this family saves itself.

Oprah Magazine said, "In her intimate but expansive memoir, Monica Wood explores not only her family's grief but also the national end of innocence. Braiding her own story of mourning together with the heartbreak all around her, Wood has written a tender memoir of a very different time."
