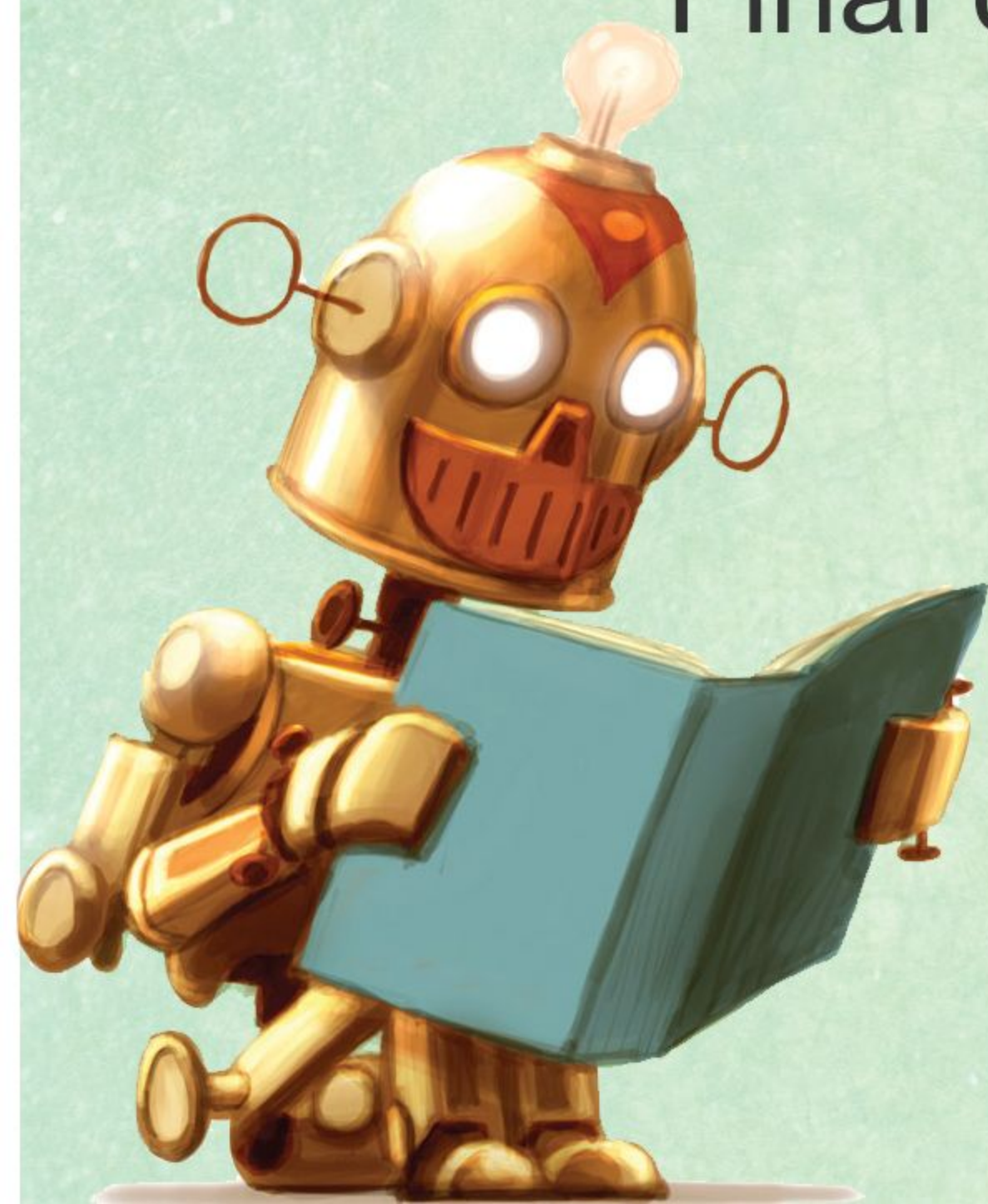

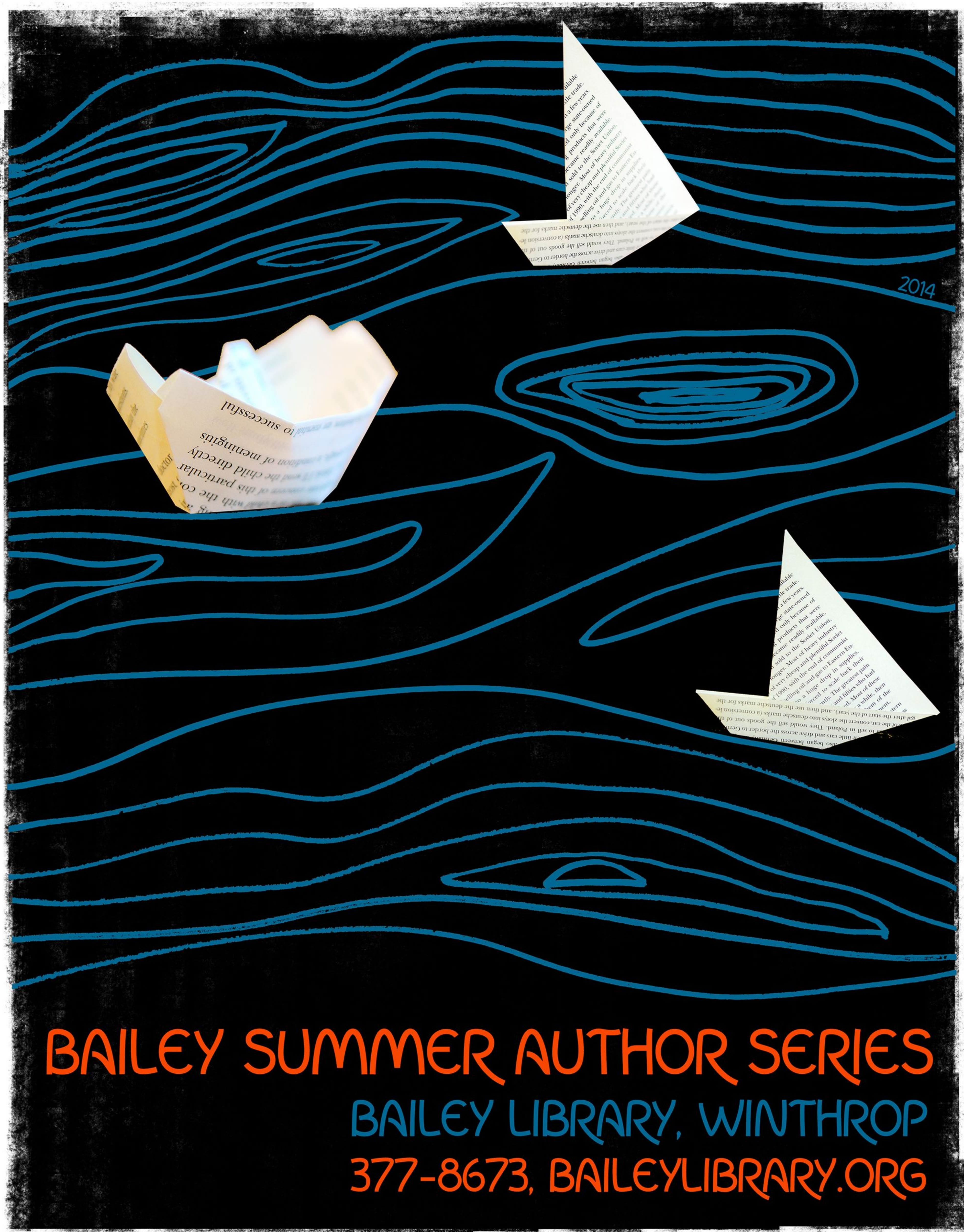
The Bailey Library is hosting lots of exciting children's events all summer to celebrate and encourage summer reading!

Winthrop Reads: Susan Conley

The library will host bestselling and critically acclaimed author Susan Conley as part of the annual Winthrop Community Read on Tuesday, June 24th at 6:30pm. Conley will read from the book and speak about the creative process. Adult Services Librarian Shane Billings will also host a community book discussion the week before on Wednesday, June 18th at 6pm. Both events are free and open to the public. The book chosen for this year's event is Conley's new novel "Paris Was the Place," which explores the complexities of friendship, family, and community.

Winthrop Reads is a community reading project cosponsored by D R Struck Landscape Nursery, Mia Lina's Restaurant, and the Winthrop Public Library Association. The program encourages all adults in the Winthrop region to read and discuss the same book at the same time.

In the novel, which the Boston Globe calls "vivid" and "captivating," Conley raises questions about the various definitions of community. Through the interlocking storylines, she forces us to think about what it means to belong, whether to a family, a country, or a cause.

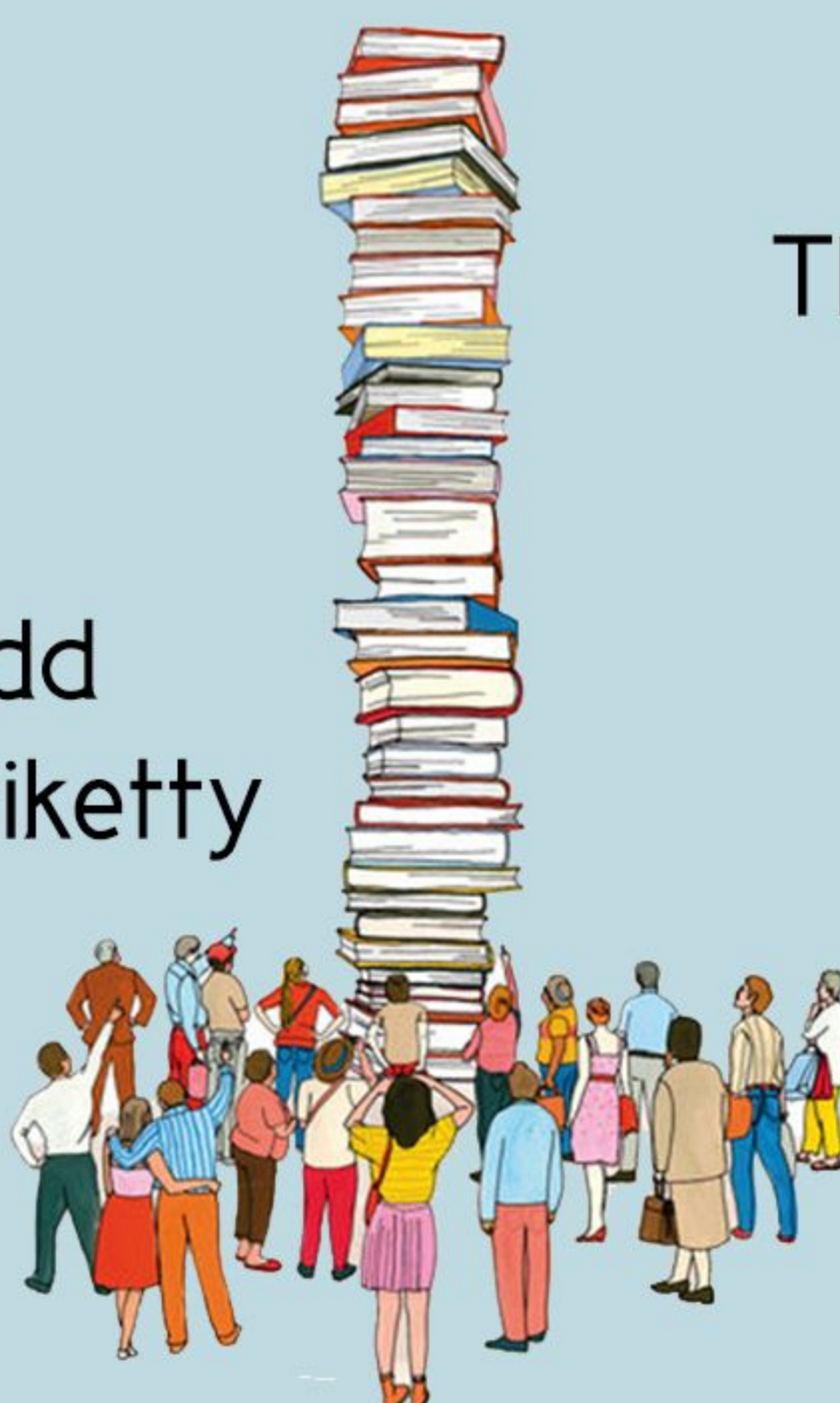
Conley is a native of Maine whose work has been published in The New York Times, The Daily Beast, The Paris Review, the Harvard Review and The North American Review. As an editor at Ploughshares Magazine in Boston, she wrote book reviews and profiles. She has also taught creative writing and literature at several colleges including Emerson College, Simmons College, The University of New England, and within Harvard's Teachers as Writers Program. She currently teaches at the University of Southern Maine's Stonecoast MFA Program and is the Jack Kerouac Visiting Writer at the University of Massachusetts at Lowell.
