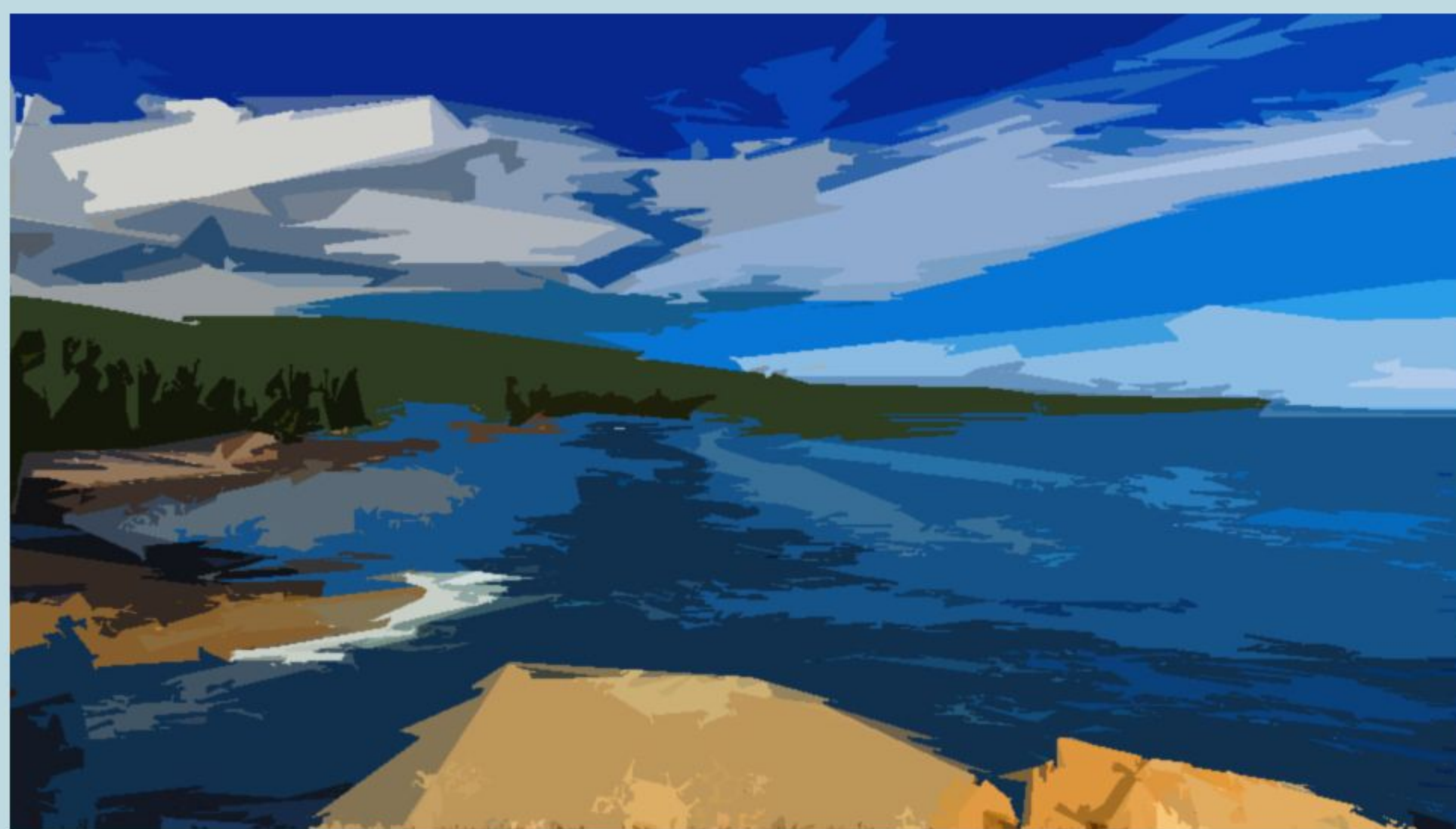

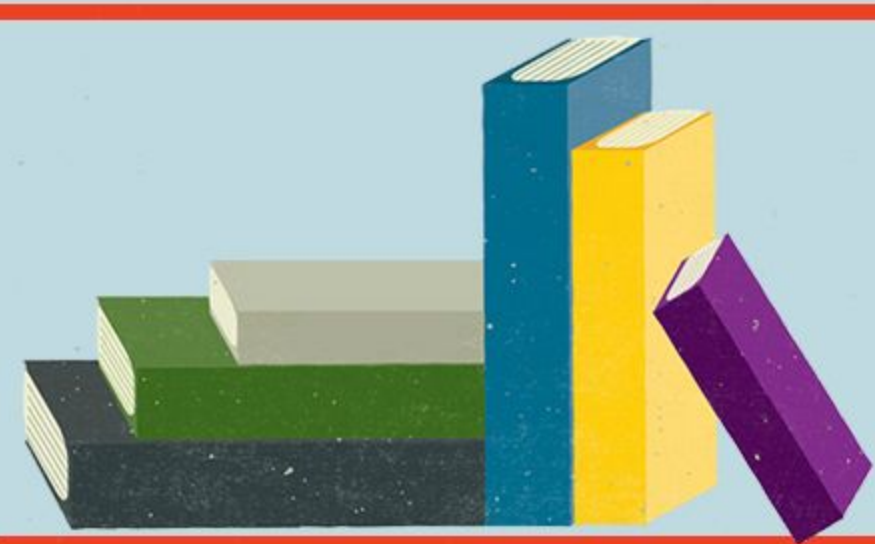
The Passes are not accepted at: Acadia, Allagash Wilderness Waterway, Baxter, Maine Wildlife Park, Swan Island, Penobscot Narrows Observatory, Penobscot River Corridor, Peacock Beach, Scarborough Beach.

Passes may be checked out for one day at a time and are available to anyone with a current Bailey Library card in good standing. Please contact the circulation desk for current availability.

NEW BOOK COMING SOON: The Silent Corner by Dean Koontz

After discovering that an odd surge in suicides, including that of her decorated Marine husband, was triggered by nano tech brain implants, FBI agent Jane Hawk goes rogue to root out the conspiracy behind the deaths. Targeted by drones and other sophisticated technology, the grieving widow hides her young son with friends and moves stealthily across southern California tracking down the culprits—primarily mad scientist Bertold Shenneck. The book is full of neat touches such as calling the brain-controlled humans "rayshaws" after the name of the protagonist in *The Manchurian Candidate*. And the prose, as always in a Koontz novel, is first-rate. Perhaps Koontz's leanest, meanest thriller, this initial entry in a new series introduces a smart, appealing heroine who can out think as well as out shoot the baddest of bad dudes.

Lakes Region Forum: Capital Area New Mainers Project

The library will host historian and author Chris Myers Asch on Tuesday, June 20th at 6:30pm. The event is part of the ongoing Winthrop Lakes Region Forum and is sponsored by the Winthrop Public Library Foundation. Asch will be joined by Ahmed Al-Abbas, an aspiring entrepreneur who worked with the U.S. military in Iraq and immigrated to America four years ago. The two will lead a discussion about the Capital Area New Mainers Project (CANMP), which is a volunteer organization that helps integrate immigrants and refugees into the central Maine community. CANMP was founded in January 2017 as a way to provide a support structure for immigrants and refugees in central Maine. The organization was spurred from informal meetings that took place amongst leaders of the central Maine interfaith community. After seeing an influx of refugee families in Central Maine in late 2016 Asch and Al-Abbas, along with a half dozen others, decided to formalize the project with the goal of meeting the immediate needs of new families, building relationships, and educating the community. Chris Myers Asch moved to Maine in 2013 from his hometown of Washington, D.C. when his wife became rabbi of Temple Beth El in Augusta. A graduate of Duke University with a Ph.D. in American History from the University of North Carolina, he is an alumnus of Teach For America and an Echoing Green Fellow. He co-founded the Sunflower County Freedom Project in 1998 and the U.S. Public Service Academy initiative in 2006. Asch teaches history at Colby College, and his new book "Chocolate City: A History of Race and Democracy in the Nation's Capital" is set to be released this November through The University of North Carolina Press. He and his wife, Erica, have three children and live in Hallowell.
