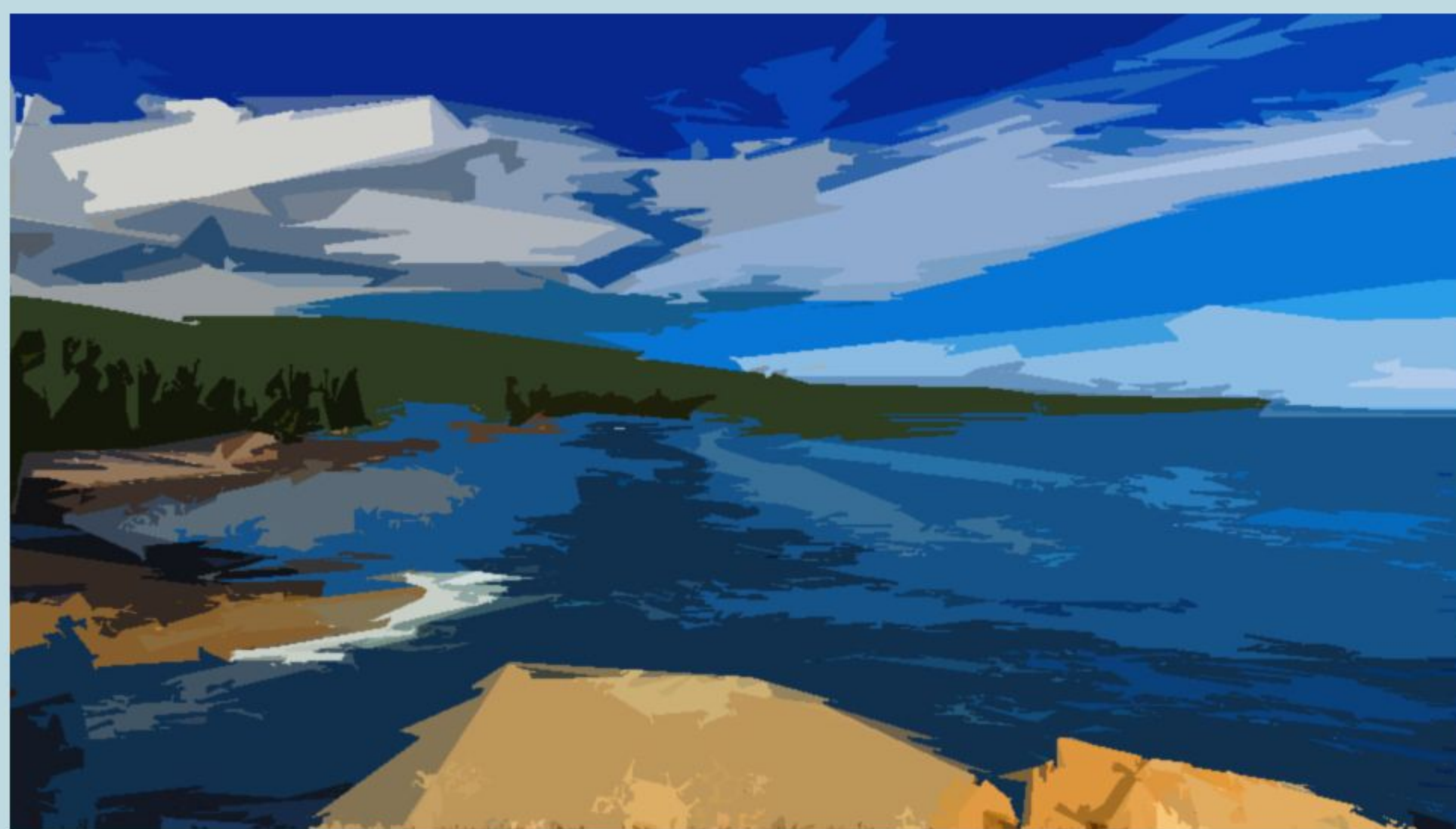

The passes admit occupants of the pass holder's vehicle (up to a 17 passenger maximum) to day-use facilities at most Maine State Parks and Historic Sites. The Passes are not accepted at: Acadia, Allagash Wilderness Waterway, Baxter, Maine Wildlife Park, Swan Island, Penobscot Narrows Observatory, Penobscot River Corridor, Peacock Beach, Scarborough Beach.

Passes may be checked out for one day at a time and are available to anyone with a current Bailey Library card in good standing. Please contact the circulation desk for current availability.

# Friends Book Sale

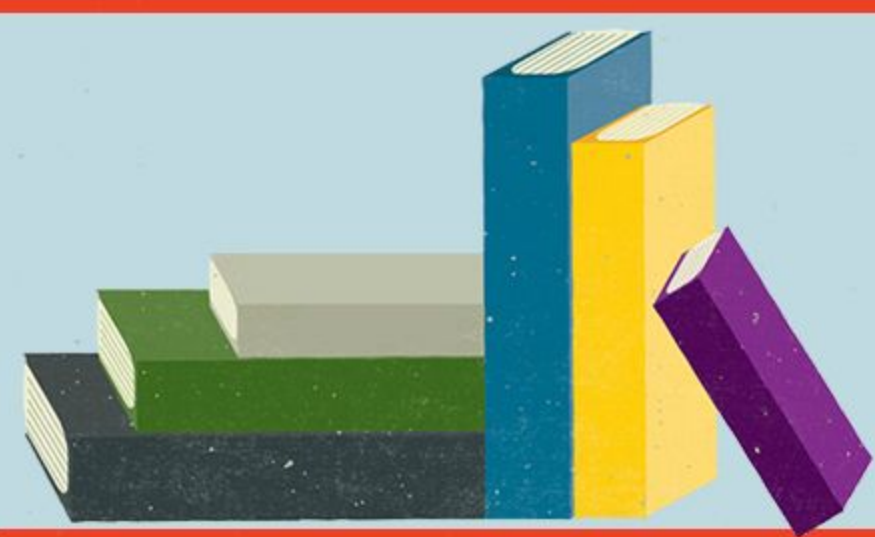

**NEW BOOK COMING SOON: The Lying Game by Ruth Ware**

Suspense queen Ware's third novel in three years introduces four women who have been carrying a terrible secret since their boarding school days, a secret that is about to be literally unearthed. Isa Wilde, happy in her life as a new mother, receives a text one morning that simply reads, "I need you," and hours later, she boards a train bound for the coastal village of Salten with her infant daughter in tow. Ware's third outing is just as full of psychological suspense as her earlier books, but there is a quietness about this one, a slower unraveling of tension and fear, that elevates it above the others. Isa is a sympathetic narrative voice though her obsession with the concerns of new parenthood may put some readers off. Cancel your plans for the weekend when you sit down with this book, because you won't want to move until it's over.

## Book to Film

NEW DVD AT THE LIBRARY:  
Before I Fall directed by Ry Russo-Young



Russo-Young directs "Before I Fall" – based on Lauren Oliver's novel of the same name. The premise reads rather reminiscent of the Bill Murray classic "Groundhog Day," but Russo-Young puts a fresh spin on the familiar theme. Kudos aplenty are in order for Zoey Deutch who's very convincing as Sam in a demanding role, which calls for the exhibition of a considerable acting range over the course of the story. Her supporting cast delivers stellar work selling an escapist fantasy, which might otherwise fall apart. It's a solid performance; better than teen-genre movies usually get, and Deutch makes the film a watchable drama for teens of any age. A deja vu-driven, surrealistic morality play designed to leave you deep in reflection and weeping.

# Community Read: Christina Baker Kline

---



New York Times bestselling author and essayist Christina Baker Kline will give a reading from her new novel "A Piece of the World," as well as a slideshow presentation on Friday, July 14th at 6:30pm. The event is part of the annual Winthrop Lakes Region Community Read, which is sponsored by the Winthrop Public Library Foundation. The program is free and open to the public, but tickets are required and must be picked up in person at the Bailey Library prior to the event.

Using personal and archival photographs, Kline will talk about what inspired her to write the book as well as the true story behind the novel and the challenges she faced along the way. The story centers on Christina Olson, the real-life inspiration that Andrew Wyeth portrayed in his famous 1948 painting "Christina's World." The painting, which is considered an icon of American art, hangs in the Museum of Modern Art in New York City as part of their permanent collection.

Christina Baker Kline is the author of five novels. Her 2013 novel, "Orphan Train," spent more than two years on the New York Times bestseller list, including five weeks at # 1, and has been published in 38 countries. Kline has also written and edited five nonfiction books. Her essays, articles, and reviews have appeared in The New York Times, the San Francisco Chronicle, and Psychology Today, among other places.

Kline was born in Cambridge, England, and raised there as well as in the American South and Maine. She is a graduate of Yale, Cambridge, and the University of Virginia, where she was a Henry Hoyns Fellow in Fiction Writing. She has taught writing, poetry, literature, and women's studies at Yale, NYU, and Drew University, and served as Writer-in-Residence at Fordham University. She is a recipient of several Geraldine R. Dodge Foundation Fellowships and Writer-in-Residence Fellowships at the Virginia Center for the Creative Arts. She is a member of the Advisory Board for Roots & Wings, a nonprofit that provides support for at-risk adolescent and aged-out foster care youth.

Kline lives in an old house just outside New York City, with her husband, David Kline, and three sons, Hayden, Will, and Eli. She spends as much time as possible in an even older house in Southwest Harbor, Maine.
