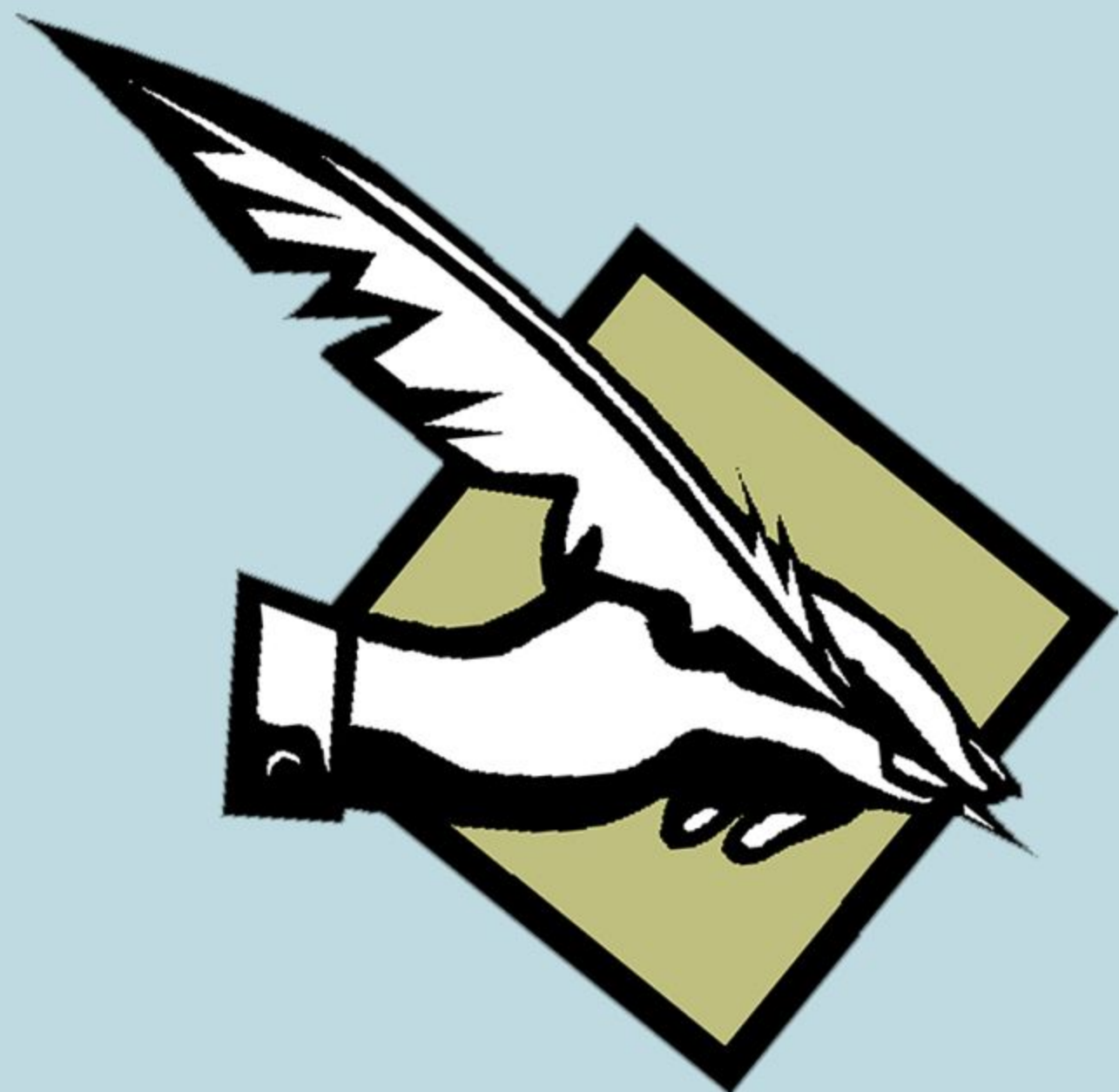

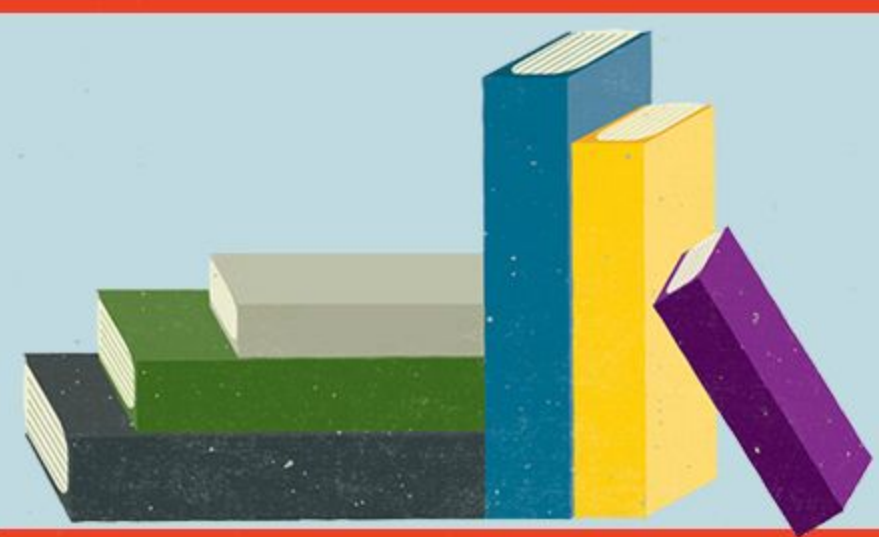

NEW BOOK COMING SOON: Love and Other Consolation Prizes by Jamie Ford

From the bestselling author of "Hotel on the Corner of Bitter and Sweet" comes "Love and Other Consolation Prizes," inspired by a true story, about a boy whose life is transformed at Seattle's 1909 World's Fair. The story focuses on Ernest, who had to learn swiftly how to navigate a world that denigrated him not only for being an orphan, but also, and perhaps worse, for being of mixed blood. Alternating between Ernest's past and present, Ford captures the thrill of first kisses and the shock of revealing long-hidden affairs. Set against a rich backdrop of post-Victorian vice, suffrage, and celebration, the novel is an enchanting tale about innocence and devotion –in a world where everything, and everyone, is for sale. A lively history of romance in the dens of iniquity, love despite vice.

Critics Consensus

Daphne du Maurier's 1951 page-turner gets an extra lashing of noir in this stylish and well-assembled adaptation written and directed by Roger Michell. Sam Claflin is Philip Ashley, the orphan who comes to live on the estate owned by his cousin, Ambrose. Ambrose retreats to Florence in his older years for health reasons and sends word back to Philip that he has met and fallen in love with a relative there named Rachel (Rachel Weisz). The letters soon darken in hue, though, with talk of manipulation and torment. Weisz underplays the is-she/isn't-she mystique superbly, while Claflin exudes callow disarray. Michell shoots with an eye for both pastoral beauty and musty, candlelit intrigue in a period thriller that keeps you guessing right up to the credits.

Lakes Region Forum: Flynn Ross

The library will host Maine educator Dr. Flynn Ross, who will give a lecture and presentation on "Equity and Excellence in Maine Schools" on Tuesday, September 19th at 6:30 p.m. The event is part of the "World in Your Library" series sponsored by the Maine Humanities Council, and is also part of the ongoing Winthrop Lakes Region Forum, which is put on by the Bailey Library and sponsored by the Winthrop Public Library Foundation. The program is free and open to the public.

"Equity and Excellence in Maine Schools" provides a Maine-based clearinghouse of resources related to equity in K-12 schools. The mission is to promote awareness of equity issues and to provide resources and support to help ensure excellence in education for all children in Maine schools. The program is an outreach initiative of the University of Southern Maine School of Education and Human Development. Dr. Ross' presentation will focus on positive, inclusive school climates that can increase student achievement, reduce bullying and violence, and model civil, participatory, democracy in action. She will also discuss diversifying the teacher work force and fostering global awareness in schools by building on cultural and linguistic differences in our communities.

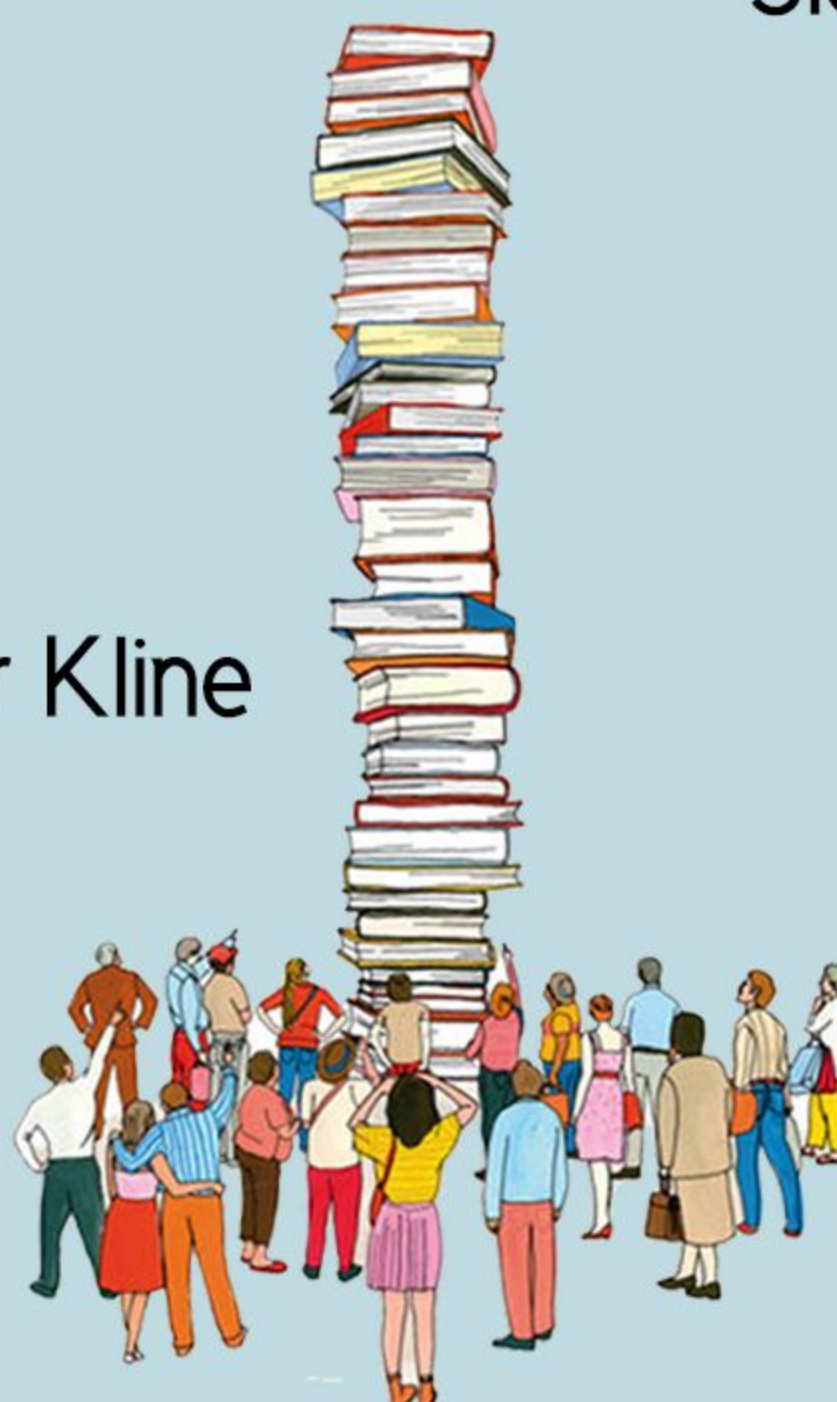
Dr. Ross is the state coordinator of the Scholars Strategy Network, which promotes public scholarship in the media and legislature to enhance democracy. Her research is focused on high quality teacher preparation and ensuring access for underrepresented teaching candidates. Dr. Ross is also involved in community action research to improve educational opportunities and attainment through the Westbrook Children's Project.
