Sarah Braunstein to visit Bailey



Maine author Sarah Braunstein will appear at the Bailey Public Library on Tuesday, August 23, at 6:30pm.

Braunstein will speak about her much acclaimed debut, "The Sweet Relief of Missing Children," which Oprah Magazine called "enthraling," and Library Journal claimed, "Gorgeous...highly recommended." Braunstein won the Rona Jaffe Foundation Writers' Award in 2007 and was named one of the National Book Foundation's "5 under 35," which recognizes five young fiction writers chosen by National Book Award winners and finalists. Her stories and essays have appeared in the Green Mountain Review, AGNI, Post Road, and on NPR's All Things Considered. Her debut novel follows the meandering, intertwining stories of three young people who go missing.

Braunstein lives in Portland and teaches at Harvard University Extension School and the Stanford Online Writer's Studio. She is a graduate of Mount Holyoke College, and holds an MFA from the Iowa Writers' Workshop and an MSW from Smith College School for Social Work. She is at work on a second novel and a collection of essays.

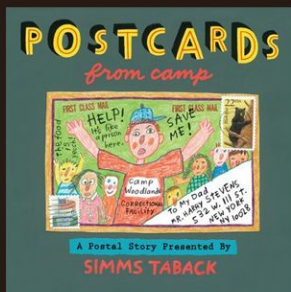
