Caitlin Shetterly to speak at Library



NPR contributor and freelance journalist, Caitlin Shetterly will appear at the Bailey Public Library on Tuesday, February 21, at 6:30pm.

Shetterly will speak about her new book, "Made for You and Me." Shetterly tells a story of young married life as she and her husband set out from Maine to Los Angeles, but are ultimately forced to return home stymied by the economic recession, illness, and an unexpected pregnancy. Reviewers have hailed the book as a "beautiful, moving, haunting, and funny memoir about what really counts."

Shetterly is a frequent contributor to NPR, where she reports on arts and culture, food, and lifestyle. She can be heard on All Things Considered and Weekend Edition. Caitlin is the Founder and Artistic Director of the Winter Harbor Theatre Company, where she produces and directs works that attempt to tackle the important issues of our time. Caitlin graduated from Brown University and lives with her husband, photographer Daniel Davis, their young son, and their salty dog, Hopper.
