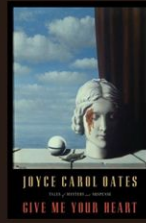

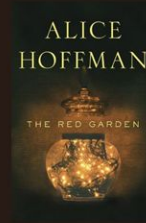
LIBRARY NEWS
