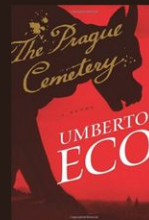

## Pulitzer Prize-winning journalist and Winthrop resident, Barbara Walsh Author Event



Barbara Walsh will launch her new book, a sea drama and memoir about the devastating 1935 August Gale off Newfoundland, at the Bailey Public Library on Tuesday, November 15 at 6:30pm.

The book, *August Gale: A Father and Daughter's Journey Into the Storm*, tells the story of the killer hurricane that roared across Newfoundland in 1935, took the lives of more than 40 Newfoundland fishermen, and devastated the Walsh family for years to come. Four of their men were lost at sea: Captain Patrick Walsh and three of his sons.

The book is a voyage of discovery, a search by Walsh for memories of the August gale of 1935 and the grandfather who abandoned her dad as a young boy. Walsh will hold a Q&A following her talk.

Barbara has also written a children's book, *Sammy in the Sky*, which has been illustrated by painter Jamie Wyeth. Wyeth is the third generation of the famous Wyeth family of artists. His grandfather, N.C. Wyeth, illustrated such classics as *Treasure Island* and *The Last of the Mohicans*. His father Andrew is one of the best-known and most popular American artists of the mid-1900s. Jamie Wyeth's paintings hang in permanent and private collections across the United States; he is known for his portraits.

Both *August Gale* and *Sammy in the Sky* will be available for purchase and signing at the event through Apple Valley Books.

Louise is not happy about her dull life in the hen house, and is looking for adventure to make her life more interesting. In four short chapters, we follow Louise in her quest for excitement. First, she goes to sea, where she encounters pirates (whose only interest is eating her). She escapes, but still longs for adventure. Next, she auditions to perform in the circus, and works as a high wire walker...until she falls and is nearly gobbled up by the circus lion. Not satisfied, she goes off to a foreign land where she ends up imprisoned with many other chickens. She picks the lock on the cage and is free, along with all her newly made hen-friends. Finally, she realizes that maybe home is not so bad, and returns to tell adventure stories to her flock. Welcome to Autumn
