
"L" is for Library!



COMING SOON AT THE LIBRARY: Sunburn by Laura Lippman

With her 23rd novel, Lippman pays tribute to a literary predecessor who, like her, began his study of crime as a journalist at the Baltimore Sun: James M. Cain, author of "The Postman Always Rings Twice." Lippman's version of the stranger-passing-through-town starts with Polly Costello on a beach vacation in Delaware, with her husband and 3-year-old daughter, Jani. One morning she says she needs a break from the sun, then grabs her duffel and heads down the road. Lippman's trademark is populating a whodunit with characters so believably complicated that they don't need the mystery to carry the book. If that's not quite the case here, you can tell how much fun the author had updating the classic noir tropes, and it's contagious. Plotty, page-turning pleasure plus instructions on how to make a perfect grilled cheese sandwich.

Hall, Oscar nominated for his screenplay of Clint Eastwood's 2014 "American Sniper," adapts David Finkel's 2013 book of the same name that was a sequel to his Pulitzer Prize—winning "The Good Soldiers." The film follows three veterans of the Iraq war, returning home late in 2007 to high expectations, and hoping to find a degree of normalcy. One of the strongest elements of the film is the sense of camaraderie. There's a sincerity and an unbreakable bond between the veterans. Hall does an impressive job behind the camera, never opting for the melodramatic, having his camera sit back and observe these men and their interactions. He knows the power of this particular story needs no embellishment, and his cast knows it as well.

Lakes Region Forum: Sarah Firth

The library will be partnering with the Maine Humanities Council to present 'Let's Talk About It," a five-part series focusing on famous Civil War Biographies. The events will be held on the fourth Tuesday of each month from February to June.

The first meeting will be held on Tuesday, February 27th at 6:30 p.m., and will feature the title 'My Bondage and My Freedom' by Frederick Douglass.

Each discussion will be hosted by Sarah Firth, who has been facilitating conversations professionally for 25 years. The series is offered through the Maine Humanities Council in partnership with the Maine State Library. The goal of the series is to provide an in-depth, personal view of life during the Civil War era. 'My Bondage and My Freedom' is Frederick Douglass's second autobiography and a literary classic of the American Renaissance. In it, the famous escaped slave and abolitionist leader gives an account of his emergence into a life of freedom. Copies of the books for each event will be available at the Bailey Library.

Sarah Firth has worked as an internal consultant at MaineGeneral Health and for a variety of small nonprofits through her consulting firm. She grew up in a small town in Connecticut and went to Connecticut College, earning a BA in English. Sarah moved to Maine in 1982 and currently lives in Vienna. She is employed by the Maine Coalition Against Sexual Assault. She is the current president of Maranacook High School's Booster Club, and a member of the Mill Stream Grange, and Union Hall Association in Vienna.
