LC Bates for Kids Returns!

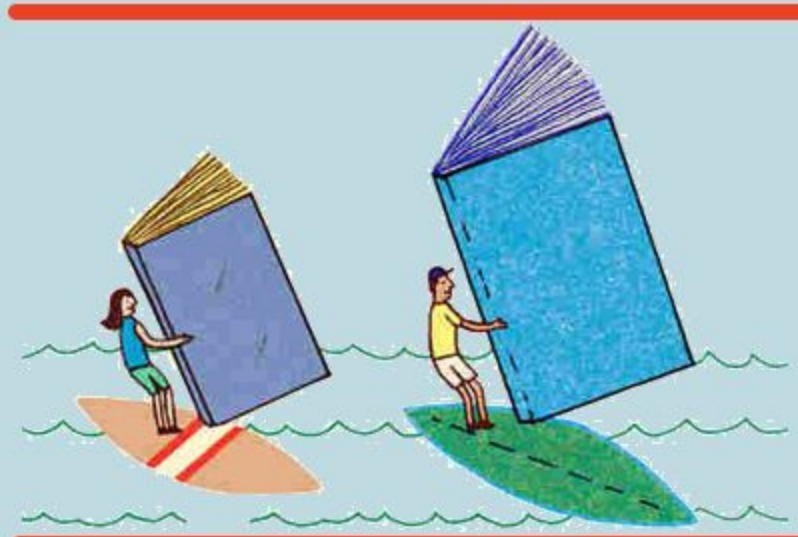

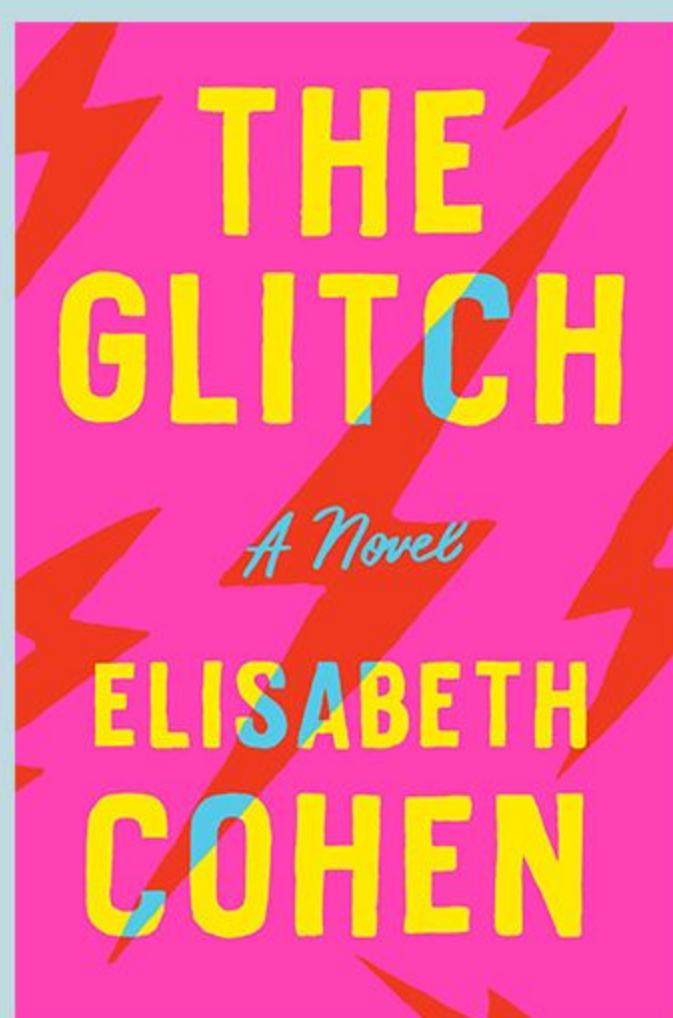


Summer Reading Starts June 1st!

Debut Author Spotlight: Elisabeth Cohen



NEW BOOK OUT NOW:
The Glitch
by Elisabeth Cohen



In her witty debut, Cohen follows Shelley Stone, a high-powered, perfect-on-paper lightning-strike survivor and married mother of two whose life gets a bug in it. The CEO of Conch, which developed a behind-the-ear personal assistant, is the perfect corporate shill, calculating, artificial, and always on message, even when things start going wrong. Stone finds herself challenged by mysterious crises—both personal and professional—in this tech industry satire, and Cohen has created an aggressively unlikable yet captivating and entertaining heroine. Twenty years ago, as a directionless 20-year-old, Shelley was struck by lightning, a trauma for which she claims to be grateful despite the physical pain it inflicted. Is a pre-lightning strike, alternate self possible? Or is Shelley having a nervous breakdown? Clever, original, and unabashedly silly fun.

Critics Consensus

Based on the novel of the same name by Jeff VanderMeer, "Annihilation" is a provocative and intelligent science fiction movie. Lena (Natalie Portman) is a biology professor whose solid husband Kane leaves for a secret military operation and doesn't return. The film is brooding, skillfully constructed, and populated by five women, played by five stellar actresses, that each add an astonishing depth to the film. "Annihilation" immerses us into a twisty world of unusual plants and animals that *shouldn't* exist. This is the sort of film that lodges itself in your brain and Alex Garland has now made two (Ex Machina, 2015) of the finest science fiction films of the 2010s, and cements himself as one of the most exciting filmmakers in the genre.

Lakes Region Forum: Sarah Firth

Tuesday, June 26th at 6:30 p.m.

The library concludes our partnership with the Maine Humanities Council in presenting "Let's Talk About It," a five-part series focusing on famous Civil War Biographies. Folks are encouraged to attend the final event even if the first events were missed. The final meeting will be held on Tuesday, June 26th at 6:30 p.m., and will feature the title "Portraits of American Women: From Settlement to the Present" by G. J. Barker-Benfield and Catherine Clinton.

The discussion will be hosted by Sarah Firth, who has been facilitating conversations professionally for 25 years. The series is offered through the Maine Humanities Council in partnership with the Maine State Library. The goal of the series is to provide an in-depth, personal view of life during the Civil War era. "Portraits of American Women" is a solidly researched collection that informs and invigorates discussion about women and American culture. The collection features short biographies of American women, which spans American history and represents women of many backgrounds in many fields.

Sarah Firth has worked as an internal consultant at MaineGeneral Health and for a variety of small nonprofits through her consulting firm. She grew up in a small town in Connecticut and went to Connecticut College, earning a BA in English. Sarah moved to Maine in 1982 and currently lives in Vienna. She is employed by the Maine Coalition Against Sexual Assault. She is the current president of Maranacook High School's Booster Club, and a member of the Mill Stream Grange, and Union Hall Association in Vienna.
