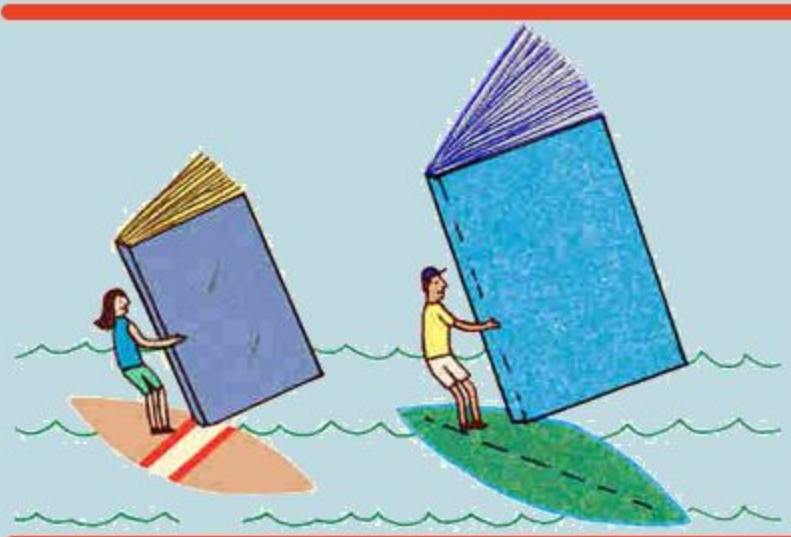

Based on the novel 'Simon vs. the Homo Sapiens Agenda' by Becky Albertalli, 'Love, Simon' is both funny and heartfelt, and one of the best teen movies since 2010's 'Easy A.' The film focuses on teenager Simon played by Nick Robinson (best known from Jurassic World), his email friendship with the mysterious 'Blue,' and his fears, feelings, relationships and traumas of high school life. The film boasts terrific performances, a cool soundtrack and thoughtful, witty dialogue. It's a classic coming-of-age story about coming out. Undemanding, immensely likeable, and proof that there is plenty of life, fun and intelligent storytelling to be had in the high school movie genre. Viewers will find the movie entertaining, infectious and charming.

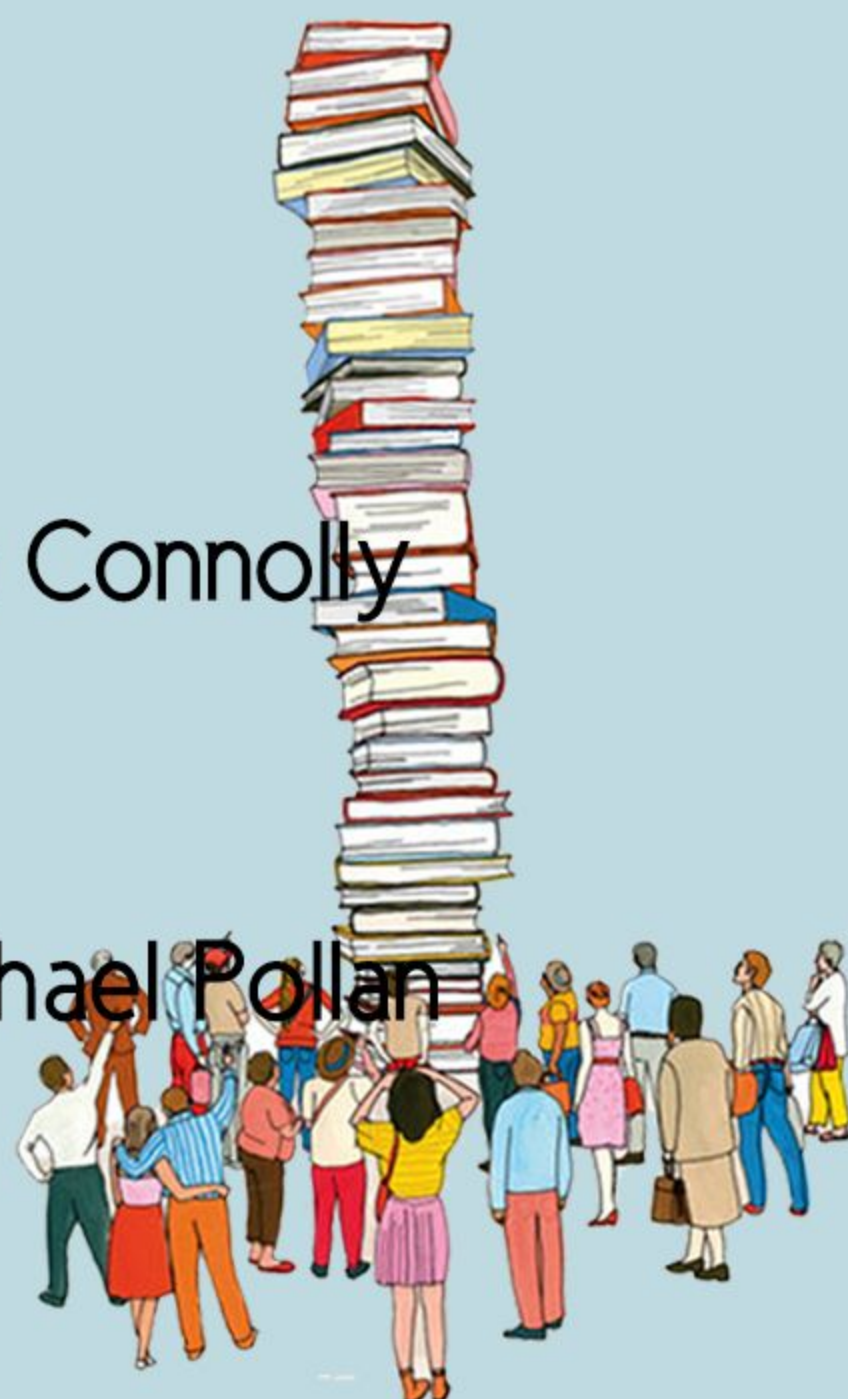
