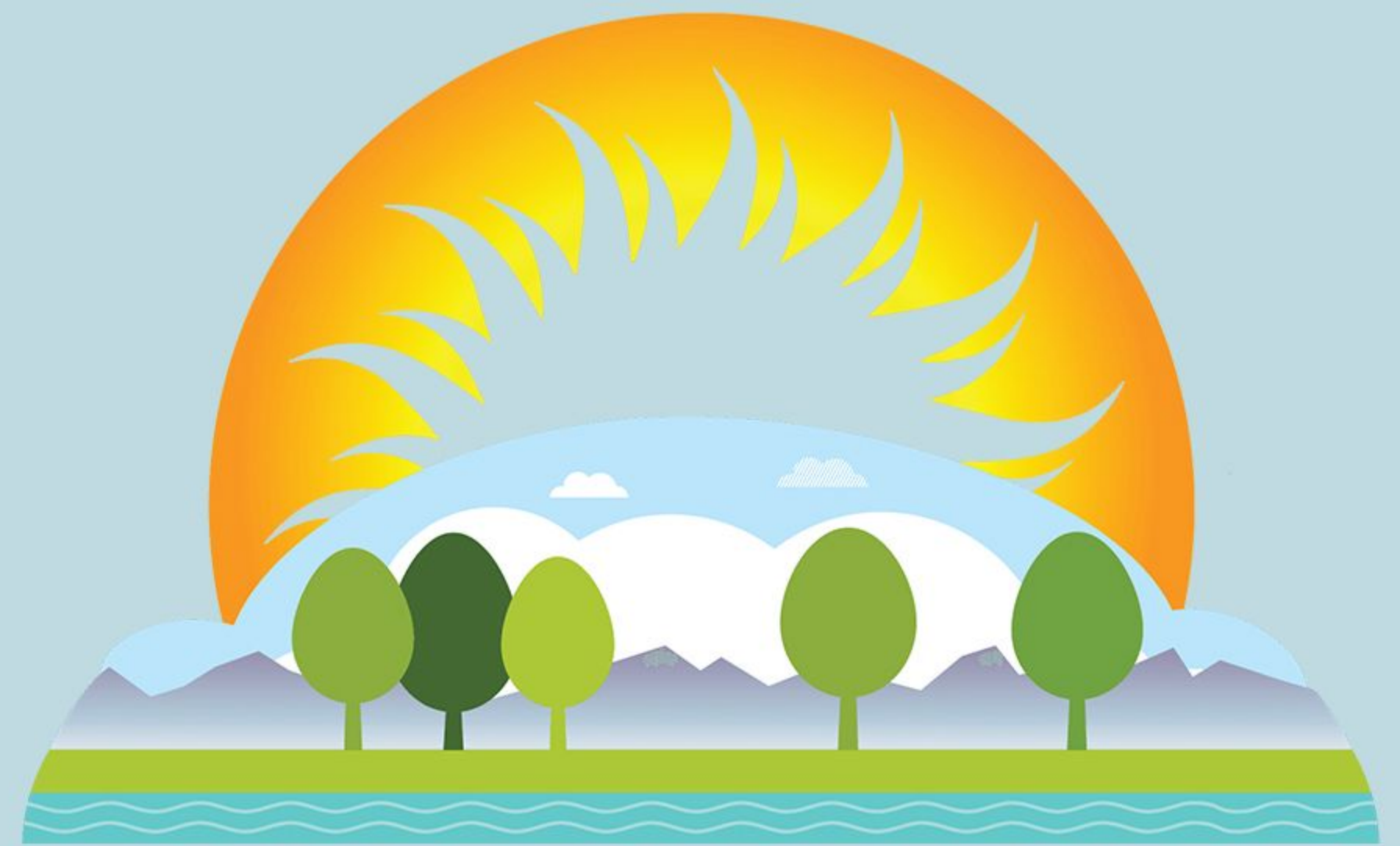
Chewonki comes to Bailey!

Set in 2045, a future in which the human race has been devastated by poverty and overpopulation – the film is an exemplary blockbuster in the purest Spielberg style. Humans use virtual reality to connect to the "OASIS," a massive online world where people can do and be what they want. Stylized and visually spectacular, it is one of the most technically impressive films in years. "Ready Player One" can be enjoyed by all audiences, but will be appreciated most by those who consider themselves geeks, gamers, or fans of pop culture in general.

New Monthly Genealogy Group

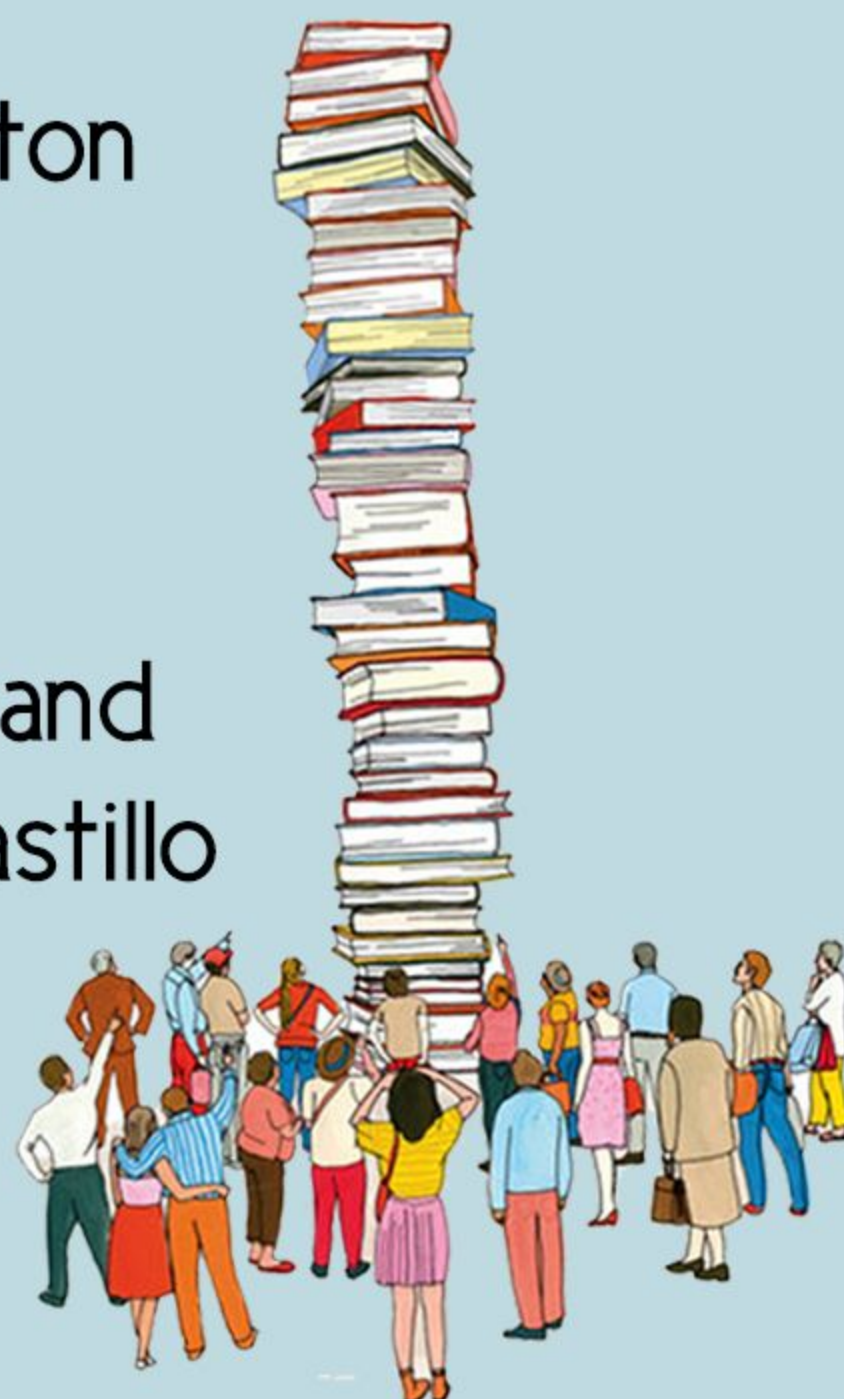
