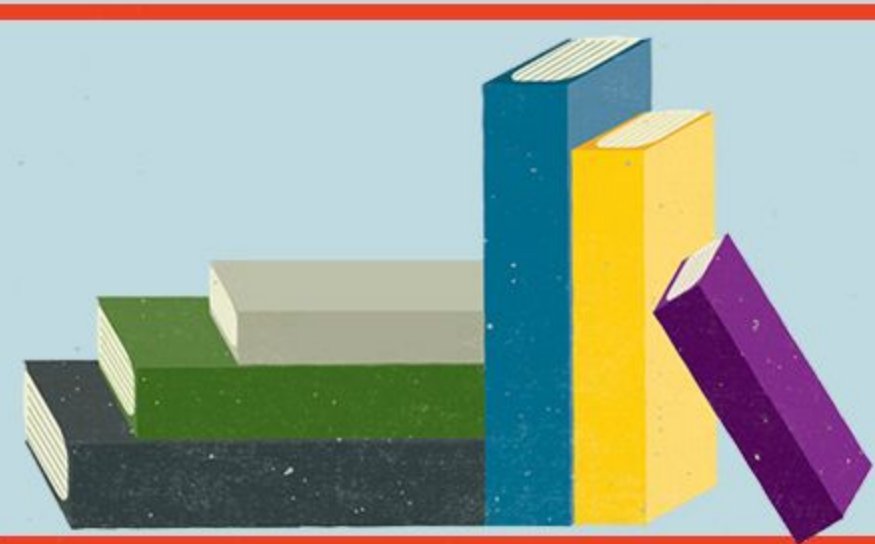

NEW BOOK COMING SOON: Newcomer by Keigo Higashino

Kyoichiro Kaga makes a deep impression on the quiet Nihonbashi Precinct. Rather than focusing on the crime scene where Mitsui was found strangled in her apartment, Kaga begins by looking at the rhythms of the street. Why do businessmen walking from the Hamacho neighborhood still have their jackets on, while the men coming from Ningyocho have them slung over their shoulders? As author Higashino describes Kaga's incursion into the lives he finds at each of the street's small shops, he seems to be crafting a chain of tiny, gemlike short stories—until the tales start intersecting, scaffolding on one another, and eventually creating a bridge between the lives of the longtime residents of Kodenmachi. Part Sherlock Holmes, part Harry Bosch, Higashino's hero is a quietly majestic force to be reckoned with.

Based on the book "My Abandonment" by Peter Rock, "Leave No Trace" is about the relationship between father and daughter, and the impasse that develops when they realize that each can't live in the other's world anymore. Will (Ben Foster) is a military vet who most suffers from PTSD. He's chosen to live in a woodland just outside Portland, Oregon, with his teenage daughter Tom (Thomasin McKenzie). He has home-schooled her, and she seems well-adjusted to their life off the grid. Few films have as deftly suggested the limitlessness of familial love, the pain and inevitability of diverging paths, and the infinite forms that family can take.

Join the Beet Poets on Tuesday, November 27th at 6:30pm as they present an evening of poetry, storytelling and music at the Bailey Library.

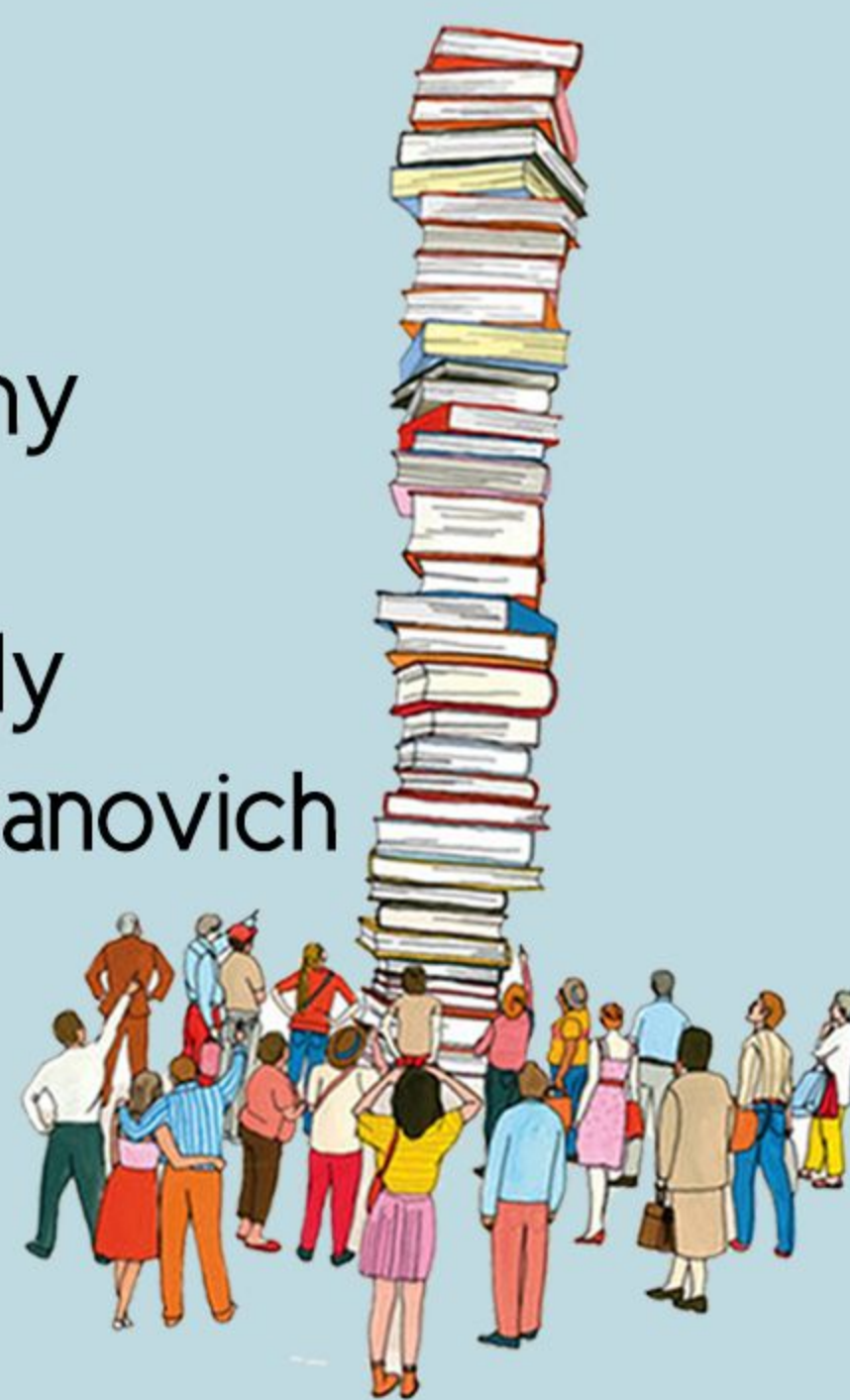
