NEW DVD AT THE LIBRARY:
BlacKkKlansman directed by Spike Lee



Based on the memoir "Black Klansman" by Ron Stallworth, "BlacKkKlansman" is the true story of Ron Stallworth, the rookie African-American cop that infiltrated the Ku Klux Klan. Spike Lee uses perspective and the voyeuristic practice of watching people watching things happening to feed the not-so-subtle parallels to our own time. The portrayals of power are explicit in the emotions Lee's having us register in the performers and spaces in the film, and Lee gives a dissertation on the potency of satire before hitting the audience with a K.O. "BlacKkKlansman" is a radical movie for a radical time, with a radical director at its helm.
